Luke 1:28 – 33 The Annunciation

Luke 1:28 - 33 28 And when the angel had come to her, he said, "Hail, full of grace, the Lord is with you!" 29 But she was greatly troubled at the saying, and considered in her mind what sort of greeting this might be 30 And the angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God. 31 And behold, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus. 32 He will be great and be called Son of the Most High; and the Lord God will give to Him the throne of His father David, 33 and he will reign over the house of Jacob forever; and of his kingdom there will be no end."

Luke 1:41-43, 46-49 **The Visitation**

Luke 1: 41 - 43 41 And when Elizabeth heard the greeting of Mary, the child leaped in her womb; and Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit 42 and she exclaimed with a loud cry, "Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb! 43 And why is this granted to me, that the mother of my Lord should come to me?

Luke 1:46-49 46 And Mary said, "My soul magnifies the Lord, 47 and my spirit rejoices in God my savior, for he has regarded the low estate of his handmaiden. 48 For behold, henceforth all generations will call me blessed; 49 for he who is mighty has done great things for me, and holy is his name."

Luke 2:1-7 The Birth Of Our Lord

Luke 2:1 – 7 1 In those days a decree went out from Caesar Augustus that all the world should be enrolled. 2 This was the first enrollment, when Quirinius was governor of Syria. 3 And all went to be enrolled, each to his own city. 4 And Joseph also went up from Galilee, from the city of Nazareth, to Judea, to the city of David, which is called Bethlehem, because he was of the house and lineage of David, to 5 be enrolled with Mary his betrothed, who was with child. 6 And while they were there, the time came for her to be delivered. 7 And she gave birth to her first-born son and wrapped him in swaddling cloths, and laid him in a manger, because there was no room for them at the inn.

Luke 2:22 – 32 The Presentation Of Our Lord In The Temple

Luke 2:22 - 32 22 - And when it came time for their purification according to the law of Moses, they brought him up to Jerusalem to present him to the lord 23 (as it is written in the law of the Lord, "Every male that opens the womb shall be called holy to the Lord) 24 and to offer a sacrifice according to what is said in the law of the Lord, "a pair of turtledoves or two young pigeons." 25 Now there was a man in Jerusalem, whose name was Simeon, and this man was righteous and devout, looking for the consolation of Israel, and the Holy spirit was upon him. 26 And it was revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he should not see death before he had seen the Lord's Christ. 27 And inspired by the Spirit he came into the temple; and when the parents brought in the child Jesus, to do for him according the the custom of the law, 28 he

took him up in his arms and blessed God and said, 29 "Lord, now let your servant depart in peace, according to your word; 30 for my eyes have seen your salvation 31 which you have prepared in the presence of all peoples, 32 a light for revelation to the Gentiles and for glory to your people Israel."

Luke 2:45 – 52 The Finding Of The Child Jesus In The Temple

Luke 2:45 – 52 45 ...and when they did not find him, they returned to Jerusalem, seeking him. 46 After three days they found him in the temple, sitting among the teachers, listening to them and asking them questions; 47 and all who heard him were amazed at his understanding and his answers. 48 And when they saw him they were astonished; and his mother said to him, "Son, why havre you treated us so? Behold, your father and I have been looking for you anxiously." 49 And he said to them, "How is it that you sought me? Did you not know that I must be in my Father's house?" 50 And they did not understand the saying which he spoke to them. 51 And he went down with them and came to Nazareth, and was obedient to them; and his mother kept all these thing in her heart. 52 And Jesus increased in wisdom and years, and in favor with God and man.

Luminous Mysteries Scriptures

Matthew 3:13-17 The Baptism Of Jesus

Matthew 3:13 – 17 13 Then Jesus came from Galilee to the Jordan to John, to be baptized by him. 14 John would have prevented him, saying, "I need to be baptized by you, and do you come to me?" 15 But Jesus answered him, "Let it be so now; for thus it is fitting for us to fulfil all righteousness." Then he consented. 16 And when Jesus was baptized, he went up immediately from the water, and behold, the heavens were opened and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove, and alighting on him; 17 and behold, a voice from heaven saying, "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased."

John 2:1 - 11 The Self - Manifestation Of Jesus At The Wedding Of Canna

John 2:1 - 11 1 On the third day there was a marriage at Cana in Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there; 2 Jesus was also invited to the marriage, with his disciples. 3 When the wine failed, the mother of Jesus said to him, "They have no wine." 4 And Jesus said to her, "O woman, what have you to do with me? My hour has not yet come." 5 His mother said to the servants, "Do whatever he tells you." 6 Now six stone jars were standing there, for the Jewish rites of purification, each holding twenty or thirty gallons. 7 Jesus said to them, "Fill the jars with water." And they filled them up to the brim. 8 He said to them, "Now draw some out, and take it to the steward of the feast." So they took it. 9 When the steward of the feast tasted the water now become wine, and did not know where it came from (though the servants who had drawn the water knew), the steward of the feast called the bridegroom 10 and said to him, "Every man serves the good wine first; and when men have drunk freely, then the poor wine; but you have kept the good wine until now." 11 This, the first of his signs, Jesus did at Cana, and manifested his glory; and his disciples believed in him.

Mark 1:14 - 15, Luke 4:17 - 21, Matthew 10:5 - 10 The Proclamation Of The Kingdom And His Call To Conversion

Mk 1:14-15 14 After John had been arrested, Jesus came to Galilee proclaiming the gospel of God, 15 and saying, "This is the time of fulfillment. The kingdom of God is at hand. Repent, and believe in the gospel."

Lk 4:16-21 16 "He came to Nazareth, where he had grown up, and went according to his custom into the synagogue on the sabbath day. He stood up to read 17 and was handed a scroll of the prophet Isaiah. He unrolled the scroll and found the passage where it was written: 18 "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring glad tidings to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim liberty to captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, 19 and to proclaim a year acceptable to the Lord." 20 "Rolling up the scroll, he handed it back to the attendant and sat down, and the eyes of all in the synagogue looked intently at him.

21 "He said to them, "Today this scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing."

Matthew 10:5 - 10 5 These twelve Jesus sent out, charging them, "Go nowhere among the Gentiles and enter no town of the Samaritans, 6 but go rather to the lost sheep of the house of Israel. 7 And preach as you go, saying, 'The kingdom of heaven is at hand.' 8 Heal the sick, raise the dead, cleanse lepers, cast out demons. You received without pay, give without pay. 9 Take no gold, nor silver, nor copper in your belts, 10 no bag for your journey, nor two tunics, nor sandals, nor a staff; for the laborer deserves his food."

Mark 9: 2 - 8 The Transfiguration Of Jesus

Mark 9: 2-8 2 And after six days Jesus took with him Peter and James and John, and led them up a high mountain apart by themselves; and he was transfigured before them, 3 and his garments became glistening, intensely white, as no fuller on earth could bleach them. 4 And there appeared to them Elijah and Moses; and they were talking to Jesus. 5 And Peter said to Jesus, "Master, it is well that we are here; let us make three booths, one for you and one for Moses and one for Elijah." 6 For he did not know what to say, for they were exceedingly afraid.

7 And a cloud overshadowed them, and a voice came out of the cloud, "This is my son, listen to him." 8 And suddenly looking around they no longer saw anyone with them but Jesus only.

Luke 22:19-20, 1 Corinthians 11:23-29 The Institution Of The Most Holy Eucharist At The Last Supper

Luke 22:19-20 19 Then he took the bread, said the blessing, broke it, and gave it to them, saying, "This is my body, which will be given for you; do this in memory of me." 20 And likewise the cup after they had eaten, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood, which will be shed for you."

1 Corinthians 11:23-29 23 For I received from the Lord what I also delivered to you, that the Lord Jesus on the night when he was betrayed took bread, 24 and when he had given thanks, he broke it and said, "This is my body which is for you. Do this in remembrance of me." 25 In the same way also the chalice, after supper, saying, "This chalice is the new covenant in my blood. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me." 26 For as often as you eat this bread and drink the chalice, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes.

Whoever, therefore, eats the bred or drinks the cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner will be guilty of profaning the body and blood of the Lord. 28 Let a man examine himself, and so eat of the bread and drink the cup. 29 for anyone who ets and drinks without discerning the body eats and drinks judgement upon himself.

Sorrowful Mysteries Scriptures

Matthew 26:36 – 45 The Agony In The Garden

Matthew 26:36 – 45 36 Then Jesus went with them to a place called Gethsemane, and he said to his disciples, "Sit here, while I go over there and pray." 37 And taking with him Peter and the two sons of Zebedee, he began to be sorrowful and troubled. 38 Then he said to them, "My soul is very sorrowful, even to death; remain here and watch with me." 39 And going a little further he fell on his face and prayed, "My father, if it be possible, let this chalice pass from me; nevertheless, not as I will, but as you will." 40 And he came to the disciples and found them sleeping; and he said to Peter, "So, could you not watch with me one hour? 41 Watch and pray that you may not enter into temptation; the spirit indeed is willing but the flesh is weak." 42 Again, for the second time, he went away and prayed, "My Father, if this cannot pass unless I drink it, your will be done." 43 Again he came and found them sleeping, for their eyes were heavy. 44 So, leaving them again, he went away and prayed for the third time, saying the same words. 45 then he came to the disciples and said to them, "Are you still sleeping and taking your rest? Behold, the hour is at hand, and the Son of Man is betrayed into the hands of sinners."

Isaiah 53:5, John 19:1 The Scourging At The pillar

Isaiah 53:5 5 But he was pierced for our offenses, crushed for our sins, Upon him was the chastisement that makes us whole, by his stripes we were healed.

John 19:1 1 Then Pilate took Jesus and had him scourged.

Matthew 27:27 - 31 The Crowning With Thorns

Matthew 27:27 – 31 27 Then the soldiers of the governor took Jesus into the praetorium, and they gathered the whole battalion before him. 28 then they stripped him and put a scarlet robe upon him, 29 and plaiting a crown of thorns they put it on his head, and put a reed in his right hand. And kneeling before him they mocked him, saying, "Hail, King of the Jews!" 30 And they spat upon him and took the reed and struck him on the head. 31 And when they had mocked him, they stripped him of the robe, and put his own clothes on him, and led him away to crucify him.

John 19: 17 – 19, Luke 23:26 – 34 **The Carrying Of The Cross**

John 19: 17 17 So they took Jesus and he went out bearing his own cross, to the place called the place of the skull, which is called in Hebrew Golgotha.

Luke 23:26 – 32 26 And as they led him away, they seized one Simon of Cyrene, who was coming in from the country, and laid on him the cross, to carry it behind Jesus. 27 And there followed him a great multitude of the people, and of women who bewailed and lamented him. 28 But Jesus turning to them said, "Daughters of Jerusalem, do not weep for me, but for yourselves and for your children. 29 For behold, the days are coming when they will say,

'Blessed are the barren, and the wombs that never bore, and the breasts that never nursed. 30 Then they will begin to say to the mountains, 'Fall on us'; and to the hills, 'Cover us.' 31 For if they do this when the wood is green, what will happen when it is dry?" 32 Two others also, who were criminals, were led away to be put to death with him.

Luke 23:33 - 34, John 19:25 - 30, **The Crucifixion**

Luke 23:33-34 33 And when they came to the place which is called The Skull, there they crucified him, and the criminals, one on the right and one on the left. 34 And Jesus said, "Father, forgive them, for the know not what they do."

John 19:25 – 30 25 So the soldiers did this. But standing by the cross of Jesus were his mother, and his mother's sister, Mary the wife of Clopas, and Mary Magdalene. 26 When Jesus saw his mother, and the disciple whom he loved standing near, he said to his mother, "Woman, behold your son!" 27 Then he said to the disciple, "Behold your mother!" And from that hour the disciple took her to his own home. 28 After this Jesus, knowing that all was now finished, said (to fulfill the Scripture), "I thirst." 29 A bowl full of vinegar stood there; so they put a sponge full of the vinegar on hyssop and held it to his mouth. 30 When Jesus had received the vinegar, he said, "It is finished"; and he bowed his head and gave up his spirit.

Glorious Mysteries Scriptures

Mark 16:1 – 8 The Resurrection Of Our Lord

Mark 16:1 - 7 1 And when the sabbath was past, Mary Magdalene, and Mary the mother of James, and Salome, bought spices so that they might go and anoint him. 2 And very early on the first day of the week they went to the tomb when the sun had risen. 3 And they were saying to one another, "Who will roll away the stone from the door of the tomb?" 4 And looking up, they saw that the stone was rolled back; for it was very large. 5 And on entering the tomb, they saw a young man sitting on the right side, dressed in a white robe; and they were amazed. 6 And he said to them, "Do not be amazed; you seek Jesus of Nazareth, who was Crucified. He has risen, he is not here; see the place where they laid him. 7 But go, tell his disciples and Peter that he is going before you to Galilee; There you will see him as he told you." 8 And they went out and fled from the tomb; for trembling and astonishment had come over them; and they said nothing to anyone, for they were afraid.

Matthew 28:18 – 20, Acts 1:4 – 9 His Ascension Into Heaven

Matthew 28:18-20 18 And Jesus said to them, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. 19 Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, 20 teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you; and behold, I am with you always, to the close of the age."

Acts 1:4-9 4 And while staying with them he charged them not to depart from Jerusalem, but to wait for the promise of the Father, which he said, "You heard from me 5, for John baptized with water, but before many days you shall be baptized with the Holy Spirit."

6 So when they had come together, they asked him, "Lord, will you at this time restore the kingdom to Israel?" 7 He said to them, "It is not for you to know times of seasons which the Father has fixed by his own authority. 8 But you shall receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you shall be my witnesses in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria and to the end of the earth." 9 And when he had said this, as they were looking on him, he was lifted up and a cloud took him out of their sight.

Acts 2:1 – 8 The Descent Of The Holy Spirit

Acts 2:1-8 1 When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. 2 And suddenly a sound came from heaven like the rush of a mighty wind and it filled all the house where they were sitting. 3 And there appeared to them tongues as of fire, distributed and resting on each one of them. 4 And they were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues, as the Spirit gave them utterance.

5 Now there were dwelling in Jerusalem Jews, devout men from every nation under heaven. 6 And at this sound the multitude came together, and they were bewildered, because each one heard them speaking in his own language. 7 And they were amazed and wondered, saying, "Are not all these Galileans? 8 And how is it that we hear, each of us on his own language?..."

Hebrews 11: 5, 2 Kings 2:11, Revelation 11:19 – 12:5 The Assumption Of The Blessed Mary Into Heaven

Hebrews 11:5 (Example of bodily assumption of Enoch) 5 By faith Enoch was taken up so that he should not see death; and he was not found because God had taken him. Now before he was taken he was attested as having pleased God.

2 Kings 2:11 (Example of bodily assumption of Elijah) 11 And as they still went on and talked, behold, a chariot of fire and horses of fire separated the two of them. And Elijah went up by whirlwind into heaven.

Revelation 11:19 19 Then God's temple in heaven was opened, and the ark of His covenant was seen within His temple; and there were flashes of lightning, loud noises, peals of thunder, an earthquake, and heavy hail.

Revelation 12:1-5 1 And a great sign appeared in heaven, a woman clothed with the sun, with the moon under her feet, and on her head was a crown of twelve stars; 2 she was with child and cried out in her pangs of birth, in anguish for delivery. 3 And another sign appeared in heaven; behold a great red dragon, with seven heads and ten horns, and seven diadems upon his heads. 4 His tail swept down a third of the stars of heaven, and cast them to the earth. And the dragon stood before the woman who was about to bear a child that he might devour her child when she brought it forth; 5 she brought forth a male child, one who was to rule all the nations with a rod of iron, but the child was caught up to God and to His throne...

1 Kings 2:18 – 20, Revelation 12:1 The Coronation Of The Blessed Virgin Mary

1 Kings 2:18 – 20 (Example of the king's mother being the queen and primary intercessor on behalf of the subjects to the King in the Davidic Kingdom. Jesus is the new and forever king in the Dividic line. Mary is His Mother.) 18 Bathsheba said, "Very well; I will speak for you to the king." 19 So Bathsheba went to King Solomon to speak to him on behalf of Adonijah. And the king rose to meet her, and bowed down to her; then he sat on his throne, and had a seat brought for the king's mother; and she sat on his right. 20 Then she said, "I have one small request to make of you; do not refuse me." And the king said to her, "Make your request, my mother; for I will not refuse you."

Revelation 12:1 1 And a great sign appeared in heaven, a woman clothed with the sun, with the moon under her feet, and on her head was a crown of twelve stars;
